

Bylaws

Article 1. Membership

1. General

1. By joining All Terrain the member agrees to the statutes, the bylaws and all other provisions as well as possible changes.
2. The ordinary and extraordinary members pay a yearly contribution the height of which is determined by the GMA.
3. The members are obligated to formally give notice of address changes to the secretary within two weeks.
4. Notices and other messages send to them to the by the secretary known address are binding.
5. The period in which the yearly contribution has to be fulfilled expires annually on November 30 provided that the amount of the contribution is announced before October 19 by the treasurer. In all other cases the period will be within six weeks after the treasurer's announcement.
6. If the contribution (article 1 paragraph 1.2) is not fulfilled by the end of the payment period (article 1 paragraph 1.5) the privileges associated with membership (statutes article 7 paragraph 1.a and 1.b) will be revoked.

2. All Terrainees

1. An All Terraine is an ordinary or extraordinary member of All Terrain.
2. An extraordinary member with a valid SSCE sport card has besides the rights and obligations of an extraordinary member also the rights and obligations of an ordinary member described in statutes (article 7 paragraph 1.b).

3. Old Terrainees

1. An Old Terraine is a donator that is no longer an All Terraine but still wants to be involved.
2. An Old Terraine has besides the rights and obligations as donator also the rights and obligations described in statutes (article 7 paragraph 1.d).

Article 2. Activities

1. General

1. An All Terrain activity is an activity that is defined as such by the board.
2. Every All Terrain activity should be in accordance with the statutes and the bylaws.
3. An organization will be appointed for every All Terrain activity.
4. Motorized sports are never part of All Terrain activities.

2. Vehicles

1. The board sets a fixed amount per kilometer for expenses.
2. Drivers of motor vehicles can, in case of damages during an All Terrain activity, call upon the therefore reserved section of the All Terrain main account.
3. The conditions to appeal for the damages fund are:
 - a. The damages happened when the vehicle is used to transport members or material for All Terrain.
 - b. In case of renting the own risk needs to be bought off completely.
 - c. All participants pay a fee of:
 - i. €0.50 for activities of one day.
 - ii. €1.00 for activities longer than one day.
 - iii. €4.50 for activities longer than seven days.
4. A contribution to the damages fund will be paid for every All Terrain activity till the damages fund reaches a maximum of €375.-
5. In case of damages the driver pays an amount of €20.- to prevent reckless driving.
6. In case private cars are used for All Terrain activities the damage claims will be reviewed by the board. In this case the maximum damage claim is €125.-
7. All damage claims will be reviewed separately by the board. The board can always decide to differ from the above stated regulations.

3. Traffic tickets

1. In case the driver transgresses and it results in a traffic ticket which the passengers could not have prevented, the driver must cover for the traffic ticket.
2. In other cases the costs will be divided among all participants for that event.
3. All traffic tickets will be reviewed separately by the board.

Article 3. Material

1. General

1. Either the material committee or the board need to approve the loaning of materials.
2. A non All Terrain member can loan materials if this contributes to the goals of All Terrain.
3. When lending the material the material commissioner or a board member needs to be present.
4. A non All Terrain member may not use climbing equipment or first-aid material
5. Setting skill or other requirements related to safety is allowed.
6. In all cases where these regulations are inadequate the All Terrain board will decide.

2. Costs

1. Use of material is free when used for an All Terrain activity.
2. For material use by a private group of members the material commissioner sets a small fee, smaller than the amount of amortization.
3. For equipment used by non-members the material commissioner sets a fee, bigger than the amount of amortization.
4. Subletting material is not allowed.
5. Costs resulting from damage caused by normal wear and tear will be covered by All Terrain.
6. Costs resulting from theft, loss or damage caused by improper use will be charged to the user.
7. First-aid kits should be restocked before returning, the costs are for the user.

3. Use

1. Material may only be used for the purpose for which it is intended.
2. After use the materials must be returned as soon as possible on a, with the material commissioner or the board, agreed moment.
 - a. The material commissioner or a board member is present at the hand in.
3. Material must be returned in good condition (clean, dry and tidy).
4. Damages to the material should be reported so that the material can be restored in good condition.

4. Climbing equipment

1. The usages history of climbing equipment should be logged.

1. Lending of mountain bikes is only possible after consulting with the mountain bike committee or a board member.
2. The person who borrows a bike should be aware of the bike rules.
3. Costs associated with renting or borrowing a bike are stated in the mountain bike regulations.

Article 4. Board

1. General

1. Board members and other officials to be determined by the Board receive a compensation for the expenditures resulting from an administrative decision or a decision of the GMA
2. Should a board member neglect his or her responsibilities, a minimum of two-thirds of the board may decide to expel this person from the board.

2. Treasurer

1. The Treasurer manages the funds of the association and ensures the collection of donations, membership fees and other receivables.
2. The Treasurer may at its own discretion make use of banking accounts and interest provisions which may reasonably be considered advantageous for All Terrain. Venture investment and / or speculating is not permitted without the approval of the GMA.
3. Declarations are to be filed with the treasurer with a receipt or proof of payment within one month after purchase. The board decides about later filed declarations.

Article 5. Statutes

1. The amount stated in the statutes (article 4 paragraph 1.e) is the minimum amount that must be paid by donors and is set at half the membership fee for regular members.
2. The amount stated in the statutes (article 16, paragraph 4.b) that the board can spend without approval of the GMA is € 900,-.

Article 6. Sponsoring Alcohol and Tobacco

1. All Terrain will reject brands of alcohol and tobacco as a sponsor.
2. All Terrain will reject events where alcohol and tobacco are the main revenue as a sponsor.
3. In case of doubt the board decides.

Article 7. Safety Regulations

1. The safety regulations are in effect during every All Terrain activity (article 2 paragraph 1.1).
2. All participants of an All Terrain activity should inform themselves duly of current safety regulations. These can be requested by the secretary.
3. Division of responsibilities:
 - a. Both the organization of the activity and the participants are responsible for their own safety and that of others.
 - b. Both the organization of the activity and the participants must at all times wherever possible try to prevent of dangerous situations.
4. A part of these responsibilities is to accurately assess whether your own physical and / or mental abilities are sufficient to safely take part in an activity.
5. Use of alcohol before or during sports activities is not allowed.
6. The organization of an activity may always exclude a person from participation in the activity (whether or not in advance) if it can be assumed on reasonable grounds that the activity is not within the physical and / or mental capabilities of the person. This rule only applies to activities or situation in which the safety of the person or others could be at risk.
7. If an activity is organized by a third party, the safety requirements of the organization must be observed, as long as they do not conflict with the current All Terrain safety regulations.
8. All of the material that is used during an activity should be of appropriate quality. Both participants, as well as the organization of the activity are responsible.
9. In the case of high-risk activities, the organization of the activity or the board of All Terrain can require participants to be in possession of a suitable (outdoor) insurance that covers such risks.
